

Rusk County Campground Rules and Regulations

This is not intended to be the complete rules, regulations and ordinances governing the Rusk County Campgrounds. For that you must consult Chapter 34 of the Rusk County Ordinance. This is just a quick reference of common rules.

Please remember to carry out what you carried in. Individual glass beverage containers are prohibited outside of your campsite area. Cigarette butts are also considered litter; please help to keep the park clean and inviting for the next camper.

Fire Rings – Please keep all fires contained within the provided fire ring.

Operation of ATV/UTVs are allowed within Perch Lake Campground, however, they are prohibited in Audie, Josie Creek, and Murphy Campgrounds. ATV/UTVs are permitted access on the road to the boat landing at Josie. Audie does have a designated parking lot for ATV/UTVs.

Please respect your neighbor. Quiet Hours are from 10 PM to 6 AM. Loud or continuous noises, such as radios that can be heard while standing in the next campsite or continuous operation of generators are prohibited.

No Fireworks.

No Firearms – This shall not apply to Josie Creek park. Please keep all weapons, including air-powered rifles or pistols unloaded and cased at all times within the park area.

Leashed pets are welcome - Please remember to control your pet at all times and clean up before you leave. Pets are not permitted in pavilions or buildings. No horses.

Firewood - may not be brought from more than 25 miles to Rusk County campgrounds. Dead and down trees and branches may be collected for firewood from the area surrounding the campground.

Each RV or camping unit occupying a campsite must pay the required fee.

A maximum of 6 persons per site. The only exception to this rule is if all campers are family members.
